65th ANNIVERSARY OF D-DAY "344TH, FIRST TO BOMB UTAH BEACH"
At first light on 6 June, the Ninth Air Force launched its B-26s to hit three coastal batteries in group strength. Among the first American airmen to witness the incredible armada of ships with their disgorging landing craft, were the crews of the 56 344th Group Marauders, which took off at dawn to be over the target at precisely 06.09 – 21 minutes before the first landing-craft grounded on the beaches. Roaring off behind formation leader Maj. Jens A. Norgaard (flying Marauder 'Mary Jo', named after his wife), the 'Silver Streaks' set course for Cherbourg. Their objective was the gun batteries at Beau Guillot, La Madelaine, and St. Martin de Varreville — one gun emplacement to each box of bombers.

On the target approach, flak claimed the B26-B (42-95902)* flown by 2nd Lt. James B. McKamey; hit in the right engine and with a fire in its full bomb bay, the aircraft was pulled out of formation and turned to head back across the Channel. The pilot's aim was clearly to ditch and give his crew the chance of being picked up, but fate took a hand and the B-26 exploded in mid-air. Despite this, three 'chutes were reported before the Marauder's sudden, violent demise, as the rest of the group turned for home, taking a course between the islands of Guernsey and Alderney. As they did so, the most amazing sight most of the airman would ever see began to unfold on the sea below. Landing-craft ploughed toward the shore, which was soon being pounded by naval shellfire.

Thanks largely to the almost total Allied domination of the airspace above them, only 12 men were killed during the landings. Six Marauders took flak damage. No fewer than 3,342 tactical sorties were launched by the Ninth Air Force during the day, these including 823 by Marauders and A-20s. —Excerpted from US Medium Bomber Units of WW2: Northwest Europe, by Jerry Scutts; ISBN 0 7110 2876 1, 2001, pps 79-83.

*Editor's note: the B26-B (42-95902), was the Bad Penny, flown from Florida to Stansted by Lt. James Reynolds and Lt. Edward Horn. Lt. James B. McKamey, from Tennessee, is listed on the Tablets of the Missing at Normandy American Cemetery.

Target — Bridge, 4 x 1000 bombs. Heavy flack, 128 guns at the target, all shooting at us in our lead ship. One engine shot out, had to land. Lt. O'Brian, my old bombardier, went down in another plane. I saw the plane blow up and go down burning. We lost 5 ships today, they really hit us hard. (#34), 23 Feb 45, hit a fortified town, with moderate flak. We flew as the lead window ship. Capt. Chapman went down, got a direct hit in the engine and went down. I saw one chute open. Staney went down today. He had been our bombardier. That makes two now we lost.
